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## SPEAKER BIOGRAPHY

**Robert Ward**, BVM&S, MSc., MRCVS, Diplomate ACVD, graduated from the Royal (Dick) School of Veterinary Studies in Scotland in 2016 and worked in general practice in the south of England for 2 years. In 2018 he moved to Canada and started working as an emergency veterinarian in Ottawa. In 2021, Dr. Ward began a Residency in Veterinary Dermatology at the Veterinary Allergy Dermatology and Ear Referral (VADER) clinic in Morriston, Ontario, and completed board certification in 2024. He became President of the Canadian Academy of Veterinary dermatology in 2025 and has lectured across Canada, as well as giving several webinars. Outside of work, Dr Ward is an avid rugby supporter and enjoys playing squash.

**Laura O'Shaughnessy-Hunter**, DVM, MSc., Diplomate ACVD, graduated from the Ontario Veterinary College in 2014. She practiced mixed animal medicine on Salt Spring Island in BC for a year before returning to Ontario to work in small animal medicine. In 2017, she decided to pursue her passion for veterinary dermatology by first completing a rotating small internship at the Atlantic Veterinary College in PEI, followed by a dermatology residency with the Veterinary Allergy Dermatology and Ear Referral Clinic (VADER Clinic) in Puslinch, Ontario. Dr. O'Shaughnessy-Hunter is passionate about educating veterinarians and pet parents on all aspects of veterinary dermatology to help improve the quality of life of pets with skin disease.
