



RESIDENT GRANT

Purpose: The purpose of this grant is to offer travel assistance to a veterinary dermatology resident, enrolled in a residency program in Canada, to attend the North American Veterinary Dermatology Forum (NAVDF) or the WCVD or any meeting considered of interest for a dermatology resident; or as travel assistance for a clinical / dermatohistopathological training; or as assistance for covering stipends related to the ACVD board examination.

The amount offered is \$500. The Grant is offered in two deposits: the first 50% of the Grant is given when the Grant is approved by the CAVD Executive Committee, and the last 50% afterwards upon receipt and acceptance of an article to be published in the Bulletin (see below the details for a description of the article).

Note that this Grant is offered only once during each individual's residency program, but the resident may also apply to the Education Travel Grant (if applicable, the candidate may apply on both Grants within the same year).

To be eligible for this Grant, the veterinary dermatology resident has to be a CAVD member in good-standing and enrolled in a residency program in Canada.

The veterinary dermatology resident who would like to apply for this Grant has to submit the application form (Appendix 1) to the CAVD Administrator. The CAVD Executive Committee will then evaluate the request and give the final approval. No receipt will be required regarding the expenses for which the Grant is requested.

In return, recipients should provide a CAVD Bulletin article (1000-1500 words) that will be of interest to the CAVD membership, for example:

- summarizing some lectures that he/she has attended
- summarizing a lecture, he/she has given
- describing his/her research project
- outlining the benefit, he/she received from the training
- providing a review article of recent dermatology literature or a timely topic in dermatology

This article must be received within 2 months following the meeting / training / examination.

Applicants will be notified of the success of their request within two months of submission.
